



May 26, 2024 Trinity Sunday

Dear Parishioner of Our Lady Star of the Sea,

We celebrate this weekend Trinity Sunday. Under the impulse of the Holy Spirit, as we celebrated at Pentecost last week, the Apostles and disciples were sent out on a mission. They do not speak about the clouds in which they had seen the Lord disappear. They know it is useless to stand there gazing into the sky. Rather, they preach God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. They baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. They announce God, God's full truth and life. They announce God to the world through a life that is true, through a life that is full.

The manifestation of God's love in Jesus Christ is available to us in the Holy Spirit. We bring that encounter with the Holy Spirit to our encounter with the whole world to which we are sent. We come alive in the truth of that love. We are to transform the world and the hearts of all we meet by the Word of the Gospel and in the power of the Spirit of God's love. We enter a communion of life and love with God available to us only through Jesus, God's Son made Man.

"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (see Mt 28:16-20). These words are taken from the scene of Jesus' Ascension and the giving of the Great Commission to the Church to bring his Gospel to the world. Jesus speaks of his unique person in which everything of the realities of heaven and everything of the realities of earth are met. Jesus, truly God, the Son of the eternal Father made incarnate by the Holy Spirit is, at the same time truly Man, one like us in all things but sin. Because he holds divinity and humanity totally in his person, our encounter with God and our transformation by the loving grace of God takes on a totally new character. Together with Judaism and, in its way, Islam, we profess our belief in One God. Unlike Judaism or Islam, under the sway of the Holy Spirit and in and through Christ, we enter a full personal encounter with God in a fully human way on our side and on God's side as well. Life, then, is truly a conversation, an interchange of life in which we grow and are transformed. God's own Word is available to us, spoken in the words of our own loves and lives. We respond to God's Word with the "yes" of our life and we enter into the communion of life and love that is God's own as a trinity of persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Knowing God, and only in the knowledge that our faith offers, do we truly honor the full truth of the human person as well.

We keep this weekend our Memorial Day observances. You are invited to join for a Blessing Prayers to be held at Our Lady Star of the Sea Cemetery at 1:00 p.m. today, Sunday, as we pray for those who have given their lives for the sake of our country. We pray, too, by extension, for all our beloved who have died. May the Lord and Giver of Life, the Spirit sent from the Father to renew and strengthen us, to awaken in our minds and hearts sincere gratitude for the sacrifices of others and effective commitment to live to the highest ideals our hearts are capable of achieving in his grace.

Our brother, Father Stephen Okoli, received earlier this week his Master's degree from Boston College. He will be celebrating the Saturday 4 p.m. mass joined by some friends from the area. We will have an open house at the Rectory following that mass for all who would like to stop by and offer their congratulations and prayers. We congratulate, too, Rick Chirlin of our Parish who received his Master of Theological Studies at the same ceremony and, by extension, all those who are receiving graduate and post graduate degrees in these days. 

## **Comments from Deacon Joe**

#### Trinity Sunday/Holiday Season

As I noted last week we are now in Ordinary Time. There



are, however, five solemnities which, together with Ascension and Pentecost, I like to call our "holiday season." To be clear, that's an unofficial term which I made up. Today we are celebrating Trinity Sunday. Next Sunday it will be The Body and Blood of Christ

(Corpus Christi) for which St. Thomas Aquinas wrote some excellent hymns, including "O Salutaris Hostia," "Tantum Ergo," and "Lauda Sion Salvatorem," which express the theology of the Blessed Sacrament very clearly. I recommend reading carefully the "Lauda Sion" which is the Sequence for Corpus Christi in the missalette. The Friday after that, June 7, is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a feast which reminds us how much God loves each one of us. In popular devotion, June is considered the month of the Sacred Heart. Then at the end of the month, we celebrate the Solemnities of St. John the Baptist on the 24th and Sts. Peter and Paul on June 29.

**Italy** My trip to Italy was very enjoyable. The tour group spent four nights in Parma. After seeing the city on the first day there were excursions into the surrounding area. At Mass for the Ascension, two priests were ordained. We visited Reggio-Emilia. Then on our way to Cortona, https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Cortona#References we stopped in Bologna. Our four nights in Cortona gave us time to see the city and learn about the Etruscans who founded it centuries before Christ. It was the home of St.




Margaret of Cortona, who died in 1297. From Cortona one of our excursions took us to Orvieto, https://en.wikipedia.org/ wiki/Orvieto which also has Etruscan origins and a spectacular cathedral. June 1 is the Obligatory Memorial of <u>St. Justin</u>, martyr. He was an outstanding layman who wrote excellent explanations and defenses of the Christian faith. He was martyred in 165.

There are also two optional memorials: St. Augustine of Canterbury on Monday, May 24, and Pope St. Paul VI on Wednesday, May 29.
